

**1 Jiggy Jog S (Walner-Hot Mess Hanover-Cantab Hall)**

Jiggy Jog S devastated her competition with a 1:55 stomp in the first of two \$25,000 Open Trot elims, for driver Dexter Dunn and trainer Ake Svanstedt. With this latest triumph, Jiggy Jog S' career earnings now stand at \$1,878,779. Bred by Vetmarka AB, Jiggy Jog S is owned by Jorgen Sparredal Inc., and has 16 wins, ten seconds, and a pair of third in 33 career starts.

This season has seen Jiggy Jog S score triumphs in the Graduate Series, including a win in the \$230,000 Final at the Meadowlands on July 8 in 1:50.3, followed by a second in the \$410,250 Hambletonian Maturity, when she was beaten only a neck by M-M's Dream. She also recorded a 1:52.4 victory in the \$250,000 Dayton Oaks on Sept. 30 in 1:52.3, prior to her Breeders Crown elim win.

Jiggy Jog S's career blossomed at age 3, which saw her score wins in the \$100,000 Hambletonian elim (4<sup>th</sup> in the final); the \$123,000 Zweig, the \$81,100 Bluegrass, and the \$276,000 Kentucky Futurity, and triumphs in both her \$25,000 elimination and the \$675,000 Breeders Crown Final at Woodbine, when she was clocked in 1:51.1.

Jiggy Jog S is the first foal out of her dam, Hot Mess Hanover 3, 1:53.4f (\$99,672) and has a half-sister on the 3-year-old Wild Jiggy S. (International Moni) 2, 1:55.2f (\$140,500).

**Quotes from Trainer Ake Svanstedt**

"She was fantastic, and I always enjoy watching her on the track. She loves to race, and she loves to do the job. She's always happy when she hits the track. It's Breeders Crown so it's tough but you have to have some luck and no sick horses. But it's the game and I hope luck stays with us one more week.

**Quotes from Driver Dexter Dunn**

"It was as easy as it looked," Dunn said of the mare's performance. "I was happy where I was, and she has such a great turn of foot. She is a lot stronger coming into her 3-year-old year to her 4-year-old year. She has put in great performances all year."



**2 Adare Castle (Muscle Mass-Pacific Edge-Andover Hall)**

Adare Castle finished second in her Breeders Crown elimination to Jiggy Jog S, 4¾ lengths back, timed in 1:56. James MacDonald was in the sulky for trainer Mark Etsell.

The 4-year-old mare has \$1,052,006 in career earnings for owners Mark Etsell, Robert Newton, Graham Hopkins, and Peter Porter and was bred by Eddie Lohmeyer. She has raced mainly in the open ranks at Woodbine all year and captured the \$61,790 Ontario Graduate there on May 6 in 1:52.1.

Adare Castle is the ninth of ten foals out of Pacific Edge 3, 1:56.2f (\$94,835) and is a full sister to Miss Muscle 4, 1:54 f (\$261,235) and a half-sister to Streamsong (Yankee Glide) 4, 1:53.4f (\$134,804). Adare Castle was a \$10,000 yearling purchase at Harrisburg.

**Quotes from driver James MacDonald**

“She’s just been a terrific mare. She’s been good forever. She’s got \$1.4 million Canadian made. She’s just a good horse. Obviously, Jiggy Jog is going to be next to impossible to beat the way she looked tonight, but my mare is a good mare. If she can trip out, I think she can get a good chunk.”





**3 M-M's Dream (Swan For All-Trading Places- Classic Photo)**

M-M's Dream was a strong second in her elimination, caught at the wire by Refined in a 1:54.1 effort. The 4-year-old mare has career earnings of \$1,327,464 and owns a mark of 1:50, taken earlier this season in the \$131,250 Dr. John Steele Memorial at the Meadowlands on Aug. 5. She is conditioned by Ron Burke and driven by David Miller.

M-M's Dream was bred by Mervin J. Miller and is owned by Eleven Star Stables, Frank Baldachino, and the Hillside Stables. She also won the \$90,000 Ms Versatiliy at Delaware on Sept. 21, and the \$250,000 Miecuna Invitational Trot at Yonkers on Sept. 9 in 2:24.4, as well as several Hoosier Park Opens. Sold for just \$18,500 as a yearling at the 2020 Hoosier Classic Sale, M-M's Dream is the first foal out of Trading Places 6, 1:53.2f (\$294,631) and has a full sister in M-M's Taylor 3, 1:54.s.

**Quotes from Trainer Ron Burke**

"I wasn't happy with her. We'll go back to the drawing board, change a couple of things. I've really not changed anything on her, and now I'm thinking we need to."



**4 Refined (Uncle Peter-Reinvent-Malabar Man)**

Refined bested hometown favorite M-M's Dream in the second elim to prevail by a head in 1:54.1 with Doug McNair at the lines. Walnut Hall Stock Farm bred the 7-year-old mare, who now has six wins in 19 starts this season and \$985,733 in career earnings for owners Joyce McClelland and Larry Wills.

Refined also won the \$34,400 Ohio Breeders Championship on Sept. 20 at Delaware, and the \$159,600 Armbro Flight on June 17 at Woodbine in 1:52. She competed in the opens at Scioto Downs all summer.

Refined is the eighth foal out of the \$386,007-winning mare Reinvent and is a half-sister to Do It For Annie (Like A Prayer) 6, 1:56f (\$224,008) and Kumbaya De Vie (Yankee Glide) 2, 2:003 (\$59,088), among others.

**Quotes from trainer Virgil Morgan Jr.**

"We bought her after her 3-year-old season, and she has just been a pleasure to train. She has done nothing wrong and been ultra consistent. She's so gritty. She's just a model of consistency. She's beaten the boys in Ohio in the open trots and she won the Armbro Flight in Canada on the national scene. She was third last year in the Breeders Crown, and she was loaded late. She would have been second if she could have gotten loose a little earlier. Doug gets along with her really well."

**Quotes from driver Doug McNair**

"She was great today, but she has been great every time I go with her. Tonight, I moved her fairly early, and she trotted right through to the wire."





**5 HP Mama B (Royalty For Life-Winters Jewel-Self Possessed)**

Bred, owned, and trained by Benoit Ballaregeon, HP Mama B was third in her Breeders Crown elim behind Jiggy Jog S, timed in 1:56 with Tim Tetrick at the lines. This hardy 5-year-old has spent most of her time racing in the Preferred, Opens, and high conditioned events in Canada the past few seasons.

Lifetime, HP Mama B has 20 wins, 13 seconds, and ten third in 68 trips postward with \$574,034 in career earnings. She took her career mark of 1:51.4s last year at Woodbine. HP Mama B is the fifth of six foals out of Winters Jewel 4, 1:56.2s (\$68,673) and has a half-brother in Prince Of Minto (Angus Hall) 6, 1:54.2 (\$153,017) and a half-sister in Summers Jewel 2, 1:59 (\$67,831).

**Quotes from Trainer Ben Bailargeon**

“She didn’t race too bad. We got third money and hopefully we’ll do better next week. She’s been OK this year. It’s tough because at home she has to race against the boys. Fashion Frenzie, Logan Park; she has to race against them. There’s no race just for the mares.



**6 Warrawee Xenia (Walner-Endless Flirt-Andover Hall)**

Warrawee Xenia finished third in her Breeders Crown elim for driver Tim Tetrick and trainer Mark Steacy. The winner of \$296,955 lifetime was bred by Warrawee Farm and is owned by Mark Steacy, David McDonald, Dale Larson, and Diane Bertrand.

Raced lightly at 2, Warrawee Xenia came into her own at 3, winning the \$61,080 Simcoe at Woodbine and the \$135,300 Matron at Dover. This season at age 4, she was third in the \$131,250 Steele at The Meadowlands on Aug. 5, behind M-M's Dream and Jiggy Jog S, and was also third in the \$74,000 Earl Rowe at Georgian Downs on Aug. 20, before finishing third in the \$90,000 Ms. Versatility at Delaware on Sept. 21. Lifetime, she's amassed ten wins, two seconds, and eight thirds in 39 career starts.

Warrawee Xenia is the first foal out of Endless Flight 2, Q1:59.1, and has a half-sister in the Trixton stallion Warrawee Yank 3, 1:52.4s (\$61,346).

**Quotes from Trainer Mark Steacy**

"I was happy with her. She was a little sorish in Lexington after her last start, so we gave her a couple of weeks to get her better and didn't train her much. The elimination will tighten her up really good for next week. She is winless in 2023 but she's raced some good races. She got beat a whisker in 1:50 this year. She just hasn't had any luck. The Breeders Crown would be a good time to start winning. She deserves to have more than she has, but she's had some tough luck this year. I think she's smarter and more sure-footed now. Hopefully, she's starting to get it together now."





**7 Ghost In The Shell S (From Above-Goddess Of Time-Andover Hall)**

Ghost In The Shell finished third in her elimination to Refined, driven by Peter Wrenn for trainer Melanie Wrenn. The 7-year-old mare was bred in Sweden by Torbjorn Ohlzon and is owned by Knutsson Trotting. She has career earnings of \$210,684 lifetime, with a 6-year-old record of 1:52.4f taken in 2022. She has 14 career wins racing both stateside and in Scandinavia, along with four seconds and five thirds in 38 career tests.

**Quotes from Driver Peter Wrenn**

“She’s kind of overachieving right now, but I thought her elimination was pretty good. I was very happy. When I moved with her, she had a lot of trot finishing. She’s a game mare. I’m happy with her.”



**8 Weslynn Quest (Manofmanymissions-Weslynn Legacy-Windsong's Legacy)**

Weslynn Quest finished fifth in her Breeders Crown elimination for driver Andy Miller and trainer Katricia Adams. The 7-year-old mare, who is owned by John Barnard, has career earnings of \$507,296 and 16 wins, 14 seconds and five thirds in 84 career starts. She is still looking for her first win of the year, despite having two seasons where she earned \$161,000 (2019 & 2021).

Weslynn Quest is the second foal out of Weslynn Legacy 4, 1:56.4s (\$105,006) and is a half-sister to Weslynn Dancer (Deweycheatumhowe) 6, 1:53.1 (\$451,200).

**Quotes from Driver Andy Miller**

“She made the final and is in a tough spot, but she’s in the final. She hasn’t been finishing off races good. She felt good turning for home, but the last sixteenth she kind of doesn’t finish it. I don’t know what the issue is.”





**9 Raised By Lindy (Walner-Birthright-Credit Winner)**

Raised By Lindy was fourth in her elimination for driver Scott Zeron and trainer Domenico Cecere behind the winning Refined, however she did post a :26.3 final brush. This 4-year-old mare has \$123,252 in seasonal earnings, with 11 wins, four seconds, and five thirds in 33 career starts. She is owned and was bred by Lindy Farms of Connecticut and has \$778,746 in career earnings.

She captured a \$26,250 Armbro Flight leg at Woodbine on June 10, and found the winner's circle again on Aug. 31, this time in a \$25,000 Open Handicap at Plainridge Park, when she was timed in 1:51.4 with Bruce Ranger at the lines.

Raised By Lindy is the fifth of eight foals out of Birthright (\$11,308) and is a half-sister to International Man (International Moni) 3, Q1:54.2f (\$205,597) and to Chase My Lindy (Donato Hanover) 3, 1:59s (\$30,255).

**Quotes from Trainer Domenico Cecere**

"She was good, she just got in a bad spot. When they go :57.1 to the half and 1:27.2 to three-quarters, it's hard for everybody [to make up ground]. But she came home :26.3. I was happy with that. She finished a good fourth. The 4-year-old season is always a transition. She's been a nice filly at 2 and 3, and this year it's been up and down. But it looks like she's on the way back. It's hard to go against the older mares, but overall, I think she's been OK."



**10 Herculisa (My MVP-Herculotte Hanover-Andover Hall)**

Herculisa was a solid fourth in her elimination for driver David Miller and trainer Virgil Morgan, Jr. Bred by Joe McLead and Billy Walters, Herculisa has \$680,275 in career earnings for owners the Jesmeral Stable. The 5-year-old mare took a record of 1:50.3 at age four at The Meadowlands on May 14, 2022.

Herculisa was an Ohio Sires Stakes Champion at age 3, winning the \$300,000 OSS Final in 1:52.3 at Northfield Park. She is still looking for that elusive first victory of the year, as she is winless in 18 starts this season. Lifetime she has 17 wins, eight seconds, and three thirds in 55 career starts.

Herculisa is the third of seven foals out of Herculotte Hanover 3, 1:55.3 (\$16,869) and is a full sister to MVP L 5, 1:56.2f (\$90,682) and Queen's Future 3, 1:56.3 (\$64,458).

**Quotes from Trainer Virgil Morgan, Jr.**

"She raced really good her last start prior to the elimination. She had the track record at Scioto as a 2-year-old and the world record [on a half-mile track] as a 3-year-old. She's extremely talented when she puts it all together. She rode the rail in the elim and had trot late and came a big last quarter [:25.3] and looked good. She got the 10-hole, following the one, so that's a good thing. Hopefully, she can pick up some pieces there."
