In harness racing, it all comes down to the Breeders Crown .

CHIN CHIN HALL
(Bay gelding, 3, Cash Hall – Canland Hall – Garland Lobell)

Chin Chin Hall finished fifth in last year's Breeders Crown won by Gimpanzee.

Also in 2018, he won a Bluegrass Stakes division and elimination of the Valley Victory Stakes, finishing second in the final.

He finished second in this year's Breeders Crown elimination.

"I was really happy with his run; why wouldn't you be," trainer Richard "Nifty" Norman said. "He's been good every start the last couple of months. He actually feels like he's getting better and better. I think he drew pretty good (post five). It's a tough group, it'll be hard enough to just get a check, but I think he's good enough to be top five."

Norman, 59, has won three Breeders Crown titles. He got his first victory with 2-year-old female trotter Poof She's Gone in 2009 and the next two with female trotter Bee A Magician, at age 3 in 2013 and age 4 in 2014.

Bee A Magician was Horse of the Year in 2013. She was 17-for-17 and earned \$1.54 million. Her earnings were a record for a 3-year-old filly trotter.

A native of New Zealand, where he worked with horses after leaving school, Norman came to California in 1985 to visit his friend, trainer Ross Croghan, and ended up staying to help with Croghan's stable. He later worked with Brett Pelling before starting his own stable.

Norman has won more than 1,200 races and \$35 million in purses. This year, Norman's stable has topped 100 wins for the second time in his career and topped \$3 million in earnings for the third time.

Peter Wrenn, 56, has won two Breeders Crown finals. He won his first in 1994 with 2-year-old female pacer Yankee Cashmere and added the second in 1996 with 3-year-old female trotter Personal Banner. He did not appear in the Breeders Crown again until he drove Shnitzledosomethin to a second-place finish in the 2017 final for 2-year-old male pacers.

In 2018, Wrenn drove in one final, finishing fifth with 2-year-old male trotter Chin Chin Hall.

Wrenn ranks No. 16 in career driving wins with nearly 10,200. He has nearly \$76 million in purses lifetime.

He followed his father, Howard, into the sport. Wrenn cleaned his first stall at the age of 6 and drove in his first race at the age of 14.

David McDuffee has won seven Breeders Crown trophies. Steve Oldford, one of the sport's top amateur drivers, is looking for his first Breeders Crown.

Walnut Hall Limited has bred five Crown champions.

Don't Let'em equaled the Canadian record for a 3-year-old trotter with his 1:51.3 win in the Breeders Crown elimination.

The colt has finished first or second seven times this season. He has gone off stride in the remaining four races. Prior to the Hambletonian, trainer Nancy Johansson said the horse had a "class clown" personality. "But I've liked him since the first time he ever set foot on the farm," she said. "You know why? He's always so happy. I think that's why he gets himself in trouble."

Don't Let'em is in his first year with Johansson's stable after spending his 2-year-old campaign with her father, now-retired Jimmy Takter (the winningest trainer in Breeders Crown history with 34 trophies). Last year, Don't Let'em dazzled on Hambletonian Day, winning the Peter Haughton Memorial in a stakes-record 1:51.4. He ended the season with four wins and a second (by a nose) in 10 starts. He went off stride in all five of his off-the-board finishes.

Johansson, 38, won her second Breeders Crown trophy in 2018 with Captain Crunch in the 2-year-old colt-and-gelding pace. Captain Crunch was the Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old male pacer. Johansson's first Breeders Crown triumph came in 2014 with 2-year-old female pacer JK She'salady.

JK She'salady went undefeated in 12 races that year and became the first 2-year-old female pacer in history to be named Horse of the Year. Johansson was named the Rising Star Award winner by the U.S. Harness Writers Association.

Johansson has set career highs in 2019 with 58 wins and \$3.2 million in purses. She ranks ninth among North American trainers in purses this year. Her top horses also include 2018 Dan Patch Award winning female pacer Kissin In The Sand.

Yannick Gingras, 40, is third among active drivers in Breeders Crown wins, with 21, and No. 6 all time in the series. He won a Breeders Crown in 2018 with Warrawee Ubeaut in the 2-year-old filly pace. Gingras won his first Breeders Crown in 2007 with 3-year-old female trotter Southwind Serena, at odds of 50-1. He won four trophies in 2014 at the Meadowlands Racetrack in New Jersey and has won three trophies in a year three times.

Gingras led the sport in purses for four consecutive years, 2014-17, before finishing second in 2018. He has finished no worse than second in each of the past seven seasons and is No. 2 this year, with more than \$10 million. His \$179 million in career purses rank No. 8 in history. He has won more than 7,300 races. Gingras was voted Driver of the Year by the U.S. Harness Writers Association in 2017 and 2014.

Brittany Farms, John Fielding and Christina Takter have each won Breeders Crown trophies in double digits as owners, with Brittany Farms ranking No. 1 all time with 16. Herb Liverman has won six finals.

Brittany Farms has won 22 Crown trophies as a breeder, No. 2 all time.

Forbidden Trade won the \$1 million Hambletonian on Aug. 3 at the Meadowlands.

He was the Ontario Sire Stakes champion and O'Brien Award winner for best 2-year-old male trotter in 2018. He repeated as Ontario Sire Stakes champ this season.

Forbidden Trade's connections accepted a bye and advanced directly to the Breeders Crown final.

"We drew outside (post eight) and it's going to be a tough race," trainer Luc Blais said. "He feels good. He raced good in the Ontario final and he's in good shape right now. I hope everything goes well in the race. We got a tough post but that is part of the game. You always need a little luck."

Blais and driver Bob McClure have forged a successful relationship in the two years since McClure left Canada's 'B' tracks for Woodbine Mohawk.

"We were looking for a regular driver for the barn and he had come from the 'B' tracks, where he was very good," Blais said. "He's a young guy, but he is a very mature guy. Very professional. He's got the talent to be a good driver. It's been a good partnership. To me, to have success, you need to work together."

Blais, 57, has won three Breeders Crown finals, including the two most recent editions of the Mare Trot with Emoticon Hanover. His other Crown triumph came with Intimidate in the 2012 Breeders Crown for 3-year-old male trotters.

Emoticon Hanover joined Forbidden Trade as an O'Brien Award winner in 2018.

Blais has set a career high for purses in 2019 with nearly \$1.9 million. He ranks fifth among all trainers in Canadian earnings this season. His stable has topped \$1.5 million every year beginning in 2016. He worked for several stables, including Canadian Hall of Famer Yves Filion's Bayama Farms, before going on his own. He now trains for information-technology mogul Serge Godin's Determination stable.

McClure, 29, made his Breeders Crown debut in 2018. He drove 2-year-old filly trotter Champagne Jane to victory in an elimination and finished eighth in the final. He also guided 2-year-old male trotter Smart As Hill to an elimination win before finishing ninth in the final.

On April 25, McClure suffered a broken pelvis in an accident during qualifiers at Woodbine Mohawk Park. He returned to action on May 23. McClure used a hyperbaric chamber three to four times a week to aid his recovery.

McClure is third in earnings among Canadian drivers this year with more than \$4.4 million. He is seventh in wins with more than 180. In 2018, he finished second in purses in Canada and third in wins. He led Canada in wins in 2017 and 2016 and was third in 2015.

Determination has two Breeders Crown trophies. Steve Stewart has bred four Crown champions.

Sire Kadabra and dam Pure Ivory were Breeders Crown champions in 2002 and 2005, respectively.

Gimpanzee won the 2018 Breeders Crown for 2-year-old colt-and-gelding trotters. He was unbeaten in nine races and received the Dan Patch Award for best 2-year-old male trotter from the U.S. Harness Writers Association.

His wins this season include the Yonkers Trot in a track-record 1:53.3 performance and his second New York Sire Stakes championship. He finished third in the Hambletonian and Kentucky Futurity.

He was named Army Of Monkeys when purchased for \$170,000 at the 2017 Standardbred Horse Sale. All of Unibet-founder Anders Strom's 2017 yearlings received names with G as the first letter.

Sire Chapter Seven won Breeder Crown titles in 2011 and 2012. He was Horse of the Year in 2012.

Melander, 27, won his first Breeders Crown in 2018 with 2-year-old male trotter Gimpanzee. The colt was named the Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old male trotter.

Melander received the 2018 Rising Star Award from the U.S. Harness Writers Association. This year, he has established career highs with 75 wins and \$4.4 million in purses. His earnings rank third among all trainers in North America.

David Miller, 54, ranks second among active drivers in Breeders Crown wins, with 23, and is No. 5 all time in the series. His most recent Crown came in 2017 with What The Hill in the final for 3-year-old male trotters. He had two second-place finishes in 2018, with 2-year-old male pacer Proof and 2-year-old filly pacer Zero Tolerance.

In 2015, Miller set the record for most Breeders Crown victories in a single year, with five. He accomplished the feat at Woodbine Racetrack in Toronto. He won his first Crown in 2000 with Magician in the Open Trot.

Miller ranks No. 2 all time in purses with \$240 million and is No. 5 in wins with more than 12,800. He is fifth in purses this year with more than \$7.3 million. He was the U.S. Harness Writers Association's Driver of the Year in 2016, 2015 and 2003.

He was inducted into the U.S. Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2014.

Strom's Courant has won two Breeders Crown trophies. SRF Stable has one.

Stefan Balazsi's Order By Stable has bred one Crown champion, Gimpanzee. Order By Stable received the 2018 Breeder of the Year Award from the U.S. Harness Writers Association. The 2018 Hambletonian winner, Atlanta, also was bred by Order By Stable.

Goes Down Smooth won the Walner Series final at the Meadowlands in April and added five victories on the Pennsylvania stakes circuit.

His sire Muscle Hill was a two-time Breeders Crown champion and the 2009 Horse of the Year in the U.S. and Canada.

Ron Burke, 50, is tied for second with Bob McIntosh for the most trophies in Breeders Crown history with 16. Jimmy Takter is the all-time leader with 34.

Burke won three finals in 2018 with 3-year-old male pacer Dorsoduro Hanover, 3-year-old filly pacer Percy Bluechip, and 2-year-old filly pacer Warrawee Ubeaut. He also won three trophies in 2017, including with mare Hannelore Hanover beating the boys in the Open Trot. Hannelore Hanover was Horse of the Year in both the U.S. and Canada in 2017.

Burke's other Breeders Crown champions included Foiled Again in the 2013 Open Pace at Pocono. The now retired Foiled Again is the sport's all-time leading money-winner with \$7.63 million.

Burke is in the process of leading all trainers in wins for the 11th consecutive year. He has won no fewer than 762 races a year since 2009 and topped 1,000 victories three times, with 1,090 in 2013, 1,093 in 2014, and 1,013 in 2018. He is the only trainer in history to win 1,000 times in a season.

Already the sport's all-time leader in training wins, Burke got career victory 10,000 on July 26 at the Meadowlands. Only one other trainer, Virgil Morgan Jr., has surpassed 6,400.

Burke also is in the process of leading all trainers in purses for the 11th straight season. His \$230 million in lifetime earnings leads all trainers in history.

He was named Trainer of the Year in 2011, 2013, and 2018. In addition to Burke's success as a trainer, Burke Racing was named Owner of the Year (with partners Mark Weaver and Mike Brusceci) in 2013 and 2018.

Matt Kakaley, 31, got his first two Breeders Crown trophies in 2018. He won the 3-year-old colt pace with Dorsoduro Hanover and the 3-year-old filly pace with Percy Bluechip. Earlier in 2018, Kakaley was sidelined for two months because of injuries suffered in a March racing accident at Yonkers. He required three surgeries, including one for a broken orbital bone and another for a fractured collarbone.

In 2010, Kakaley was given the Rising Star Award by the U.S. Harness Writers Association. He has won more than 4,600 races and \$74 million in purses lifetime.

Burke Racing has won 11 Breeders Crown finals and the Weaver Brusceci partnership has nine. William Switala and James Martin are seeking their first trophy.

Concord Stud Farm is seeking its first Breeders Crown.

Swedish-born Green Manalishi S finished second to stablemate Gimpanzee in last year's Breeders Crown final for 2-year-old colt-and-gelding trotters.

His wins last year included the William Wellwood Memorial at Woodbine Mohawk Park. His triumphs this season include the Canadian Trotting Classic and Simcoe, both at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The colt was named Nagamori Hill when Anders Strom purchased him for a Swedish-auction-record 3 million kronor in 2017. All of Unibet-founder Strom's 2017 yearlings received names with G as the first letter and Nagamori Hill was renamed after a 1970 Fleetwood Mac song later covered by Strom's favorite band Judas Priest.

Muscle Hill, the sire of Green Manalishi S, was a two-time Breeders Crown champion and the 2009 Horse of the Year in the U.S. and Canada.

Marcus Melander, 27, won his first Breeders Crown in 2018 with 2-year-old male trotter Gimpanzee. The colt was named the Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old male trotter.

Melander received the 2018 Rising Star Award from the U.S. Harness Writers Association. This year, he has established career highs with 75 wins and \$4.4 million in purses. His earnings rank third among all trainers in North America.

Tim Tetrick, 37, is fourth among active drivers in Breeders Crown wins, with 20, and is No. 7 all time in the series. He won two finals last year, the Mare Pace with Shartin N and the 3-year-old filly trot with Lily Stride. Tetrick won a career-high four Breeders Crown trophies in 2012 at Woodbine Racetrack.

For his career, Tetrick ranks No. 4 all time in purses with \$215 million and No. 9 in wins with more than 11,200. As of Oct. 22, he was within \$7,000 of passing Ron Pierce for third on the earnings list.

Tetrick was elected to the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in September and will be inducted next summer.

In 2007, Tetrick won a single-season-record 1,189 races and was named the U.S. Harness Writers Association's Rising Star Award winner as well as Driver of the Year. That season he became the first driver to lead the sport in both wins and purses (a then-record \$18.3 million) in the same year since 1991.

Driver of the Year honors from the U.S. Harness Writers Association followed in 2008, 2012 and 2013.

Tetrick led the sport in purses seven consecutive years (2007 through 2013) and was No. 1 again in 2018. He leads in earnings for 2019 with \$13 million and is No. 2 in wins with more than 600. He has ranked among the Top 10 drivers in wins for 14 consecutive years, beginning in 2005.

Strom's Courant has won two Breeders Crown trophies.

Greenshoe brings a five-race win streak to the Breeders Crown. His connections accepted a bye to advance directly to the final.

"He's doing great," trainer Marcus Melander said. "I was happy to take the bye with him. He's been on the road for a long time, so it was nice for him to be at home. I'm very happy with how he feels. I'm confident going into the race, he feels as good as he can. I think he'll be good."

Greenshoe's victories this season include the Kentucky Futurity, Dr. Harry M. Zweig Memorial, New Jersey Sire Stakes championship, Kentucky Sire Stakes championship, and a division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial. The colt's 1:49.4 triumph in a division of the Bluegrass Stakes on Sept. 29 is the fastest mile of the season for a 3-year-old trotter and the fourth sub-1:50 winning mile by a 3-year-old in history.

Last year, the highly regarded colt went off stride behind the starting gate or at the beginning of each of his four races, although he was able to recover and win two.

Father Patrick, Greenshoe's sire, was a two-time Breeders Crown champion (2013 and 2014).

Greenshoe sold for \$330,000 under the name Rifleman at the 2017 Lexington Selected Sale. Earlier this month, his full brother Maverick sold for a record \$1.1 million at the same sale.

The name Greenshoe is a reference to a financial term. All of Unibet-founder Anders Strom's 2017 yearlings received names with G as the first letter.

Melander, 27, won his first Breeders Crown in 2018 with 2-year-old male trotter Gimpanzee. The colt was named the Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old male trotter.

Melander received the 2018 Rising Star Award from the U.S. Harness Writers Association. This year, he has established career highs with 75 wins and \$4.4 million in purses. His earnings rank third among all trainers in North America.

Brian Sears, 51, leads all active drivers in wins in the Breeders Crown, with 30, and is tied with Ron Pierce for the second-most trophies in the history of the series. Sears trails only John Campbell (48).

Sears won three Breeders Crown finals in 2018. His triumphs came with 2-year-old male trotter Gimpanzee, 3-year-old male trotter Tactical Landing, and older male pacer McWicked.

In July 2017, Sears was inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame. For his career, Sears has won more than 10,100 races and \$194 million in purses. He ranks 17th in North American history for wins among drivers and fifth in purses.

Strom's Courant stable has won two Breeders Crown trophies. The remaining Greenshoe partners are seeking their first.

Al Libfeld has six Crown wins as a breeder and Marvin Katz has four. The Libfeld/Katz Breeding Partnership was Canada's Breeder of the Year in 2015, 2016 and 2017. The partnership is the corporate sponsor of this year's Breeders Crown at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Marseille's top win this year came in the Earl Beal Jr. Memorial on June 29 at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono. He defeated favorite Greenshoe by a head at odds of 57-1.

Last year, Marseille was limited to four races because of soreness. When he returned this year, his behavior left much to be desired. The connections considered gelding Marseille but decided to hold off and gave the colt another opportunity to show improvement. He finished second in a qualifier and then won his seasonal debut, which ended the discussion.

"Maybe he heard what we were talking about," trainer Ake Svanstedt said with a smile earlier this year. "After he qualified and started racing, his head changed totally. He is not a stud when he comes to race. He has focus. He is a real racehorse and he wants to race. He is all business."

Marseille's sire Muscle Hill was a two-time Breeders Crown champion and the 2009 Horse of the Year in the U.S. and Canada.

Svanstedt, 60, is seeking his first Breeders Crown trophy.

He has finished second on four occasions, twice with Resolve in the Open Trot, in 2015 and 2016, and twice with Ice Attraction, in 2017 in the 3-year-old filly trot and 2018 in the Mare Trot. Also last year, Plunge Blue Chip won her elimination for 3-year-old filly trotters and finished third in the final.

Svanstedt is in his sixth season of racing in North America after moving to the U.S. from Sweden. He was Sweden's Trainer of the Year five times and Driver of the Year on three occasions. In 2017, Svanstedt was inducted in Sweden's Hall of Fame. Svanstedt won 6,306 races as a driver in Sweden and 5,384 as a trainer.

Soul Strong is seeking his first Grand Circuit win but earned paychecks in all three Trotting Triple Crown races this year. He finished fourth in the Hambletonian, third in the Yonkers Trot, and fourth in the Kentucky Futurity.

Father Patrick, Soul Strong's sire, was a two-time Breeders Crown champion (2013 and 2014). Soul Strong's dam Sheer Soul was a Breeders Crown finalist in 2006.

Ake Svanstedt, 60, is seeking his first Breeders Crown trophy.

He has finished second on four occasions, twice with Resolve in the Open Trot, in 2015 and 2016, and twice with Ice Attraction, in 2017 in the 3-year-old filly trot and 2018 in the Mare Trot. Also last year, Plunge Blue Chip won her elimination for 3-year-old filly trotters and finished third in the final.

Svanstedt is in his sixth season of racing in North America after moving to the U.S. from Sweden. He was Sweden's Trainer of the Year five times and Driver of the Year on three occasions. During that span, he won at least 200 races on six occasions and twice finished with 199. He was the first New Zealand driver to win at least 200 races in a season.

Dunn was invited to drive in the U.S. last summer by trainer Chris Ryder, a longtime family friend. Dunn's top horse this year has been Bettor's Wish, a 3-year-old pacing colt trained and co-owned by Ryder.

When Dunn left New Zealand, his 2,225 wins ranked fifth in history there. He was the youngest driver to both 1,000 and 2,000 wins, and the youngest, at the age of 18, to win a Group 1 race in New Zealand. In 2015, Dunn represented his country in the World Driving Championship and drove off with the trophy.

Dunn ranks third this year in purses among all drivers in North America with more than \$9 million.

This is Stable Why Not's first Breeders Crown appearance.

Al Libfeld has six Crown wins as a breeder and Marvin Katz has four. The Libfeld/Katz Breeding Partnership was Canada's Breeder of the Year in 2015, 2016 and 2017. The partnership is the corporate sponsor of this year's Breeders Crown at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Super Schissel was a two-time Grand Circuit winner at 2. He won the Matron Stakes and a division of the International Stallion Stakes. He finished fourth in the Breeders Crown final, won by Gimpanzee.

This year, the colt had third-place finishes in the Goodtimes, a division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial, and the Kentucky Sire Stakes championship.

Super Schissel's sire Uncle Peter was a Breeders Crown champion at age 2 in 2011.

Per Engblom, 39, is making his Breeders Crown debut but is no stranger to the event after spending the past six years as the top assistant to Hall of Fame trainer Jimmy Takter. The Takter Stable won 19 of its record 34 Breeders Crown trophies during that time frame.

Since starting his own stable this season, Engblom has won 66 races and nearly \$2.5 million in purses.

Engblom grew up in Mantorp, Sweden, which is also Takter's birthplace. Both men began their careers at the local racetrack, which was started by a group that included Engblom's grandfather, Bengt Engblom. Per Engblom's father, Raoul, also is a trainer.

This is Engblom's second stint in the U.S. He was 19 when he came to the States for the first time. His sister, Pernilla, worked for Takter and the stable needed additional help. Engblom worked as a groom for two years before assisting with training for another three years. He then returned home to Sweden, where he was the private trainer for Stall Tilly, and later worked in Italy before starting his own public stable.

At the beginning of 2012, Engblom and his wife, Helene, decided to move to the U.S. with their then 4-year-old son, Tom, who was ready to start school. Engblom worked for a year with trainer Tony Alagna before returning to the Takter Stable, where Helene joined him.

Louis Philippe Roy, 29, made his Breeders Crown debut in 2017 and finished third with Pink Pistol in the Mare Trot.

Roy spent six years competing, and dominating, on the Quebec fair circuit before making a name for himself at Hippodrome 3R (Trois-Rivières), which propelled him to regular drives on the Woodbine-Mohawk/Ontario circuit.

He was named Canada's Driver of the Year in 2018. He led all Canadian drivers in purses with \$6.79 million and wins with 413. This year, he is battling Sylvain Filion for the top spot in earnings and is second in victories.

Roy won 380 races in 2017, good for second among all drivers in Canada, and earned \$5.74 million in purses and was a finalist for Canada's Driver of the Year, which ultimately went to Doug McNair. For his career, Roy has won more than 1,400 races and \$16 million.

Al Libfeld has won nine Breeders Crown trophies. Perry Soderberg is seeking his first.
