TWELVE SEPARATE RACES

FOR 2-YEAR-OLDS IN 2006, 3-YEAR-OLDS IN 2007, AND OPEN AND MARE RACES FOR TROTTERS AND PACERS IN 2008.

OWNED AND SERVICED BY: The Hambletonian Society, Inc.

FOR: Eligible foals of 2004 (subject to U.S.T.A. foaling date rules) whose sires were nominated to this Breeders Crown No. 20 and are eligible, or who are made eligible, in accordance with the conditions below and the conditions to be published in the year of the specific races. These foals will be eligible to 2-year-old races in 2006, 3-year-old races in 2007 and open races in 2008 and thereafter, in accordance with the conditions of those specific races.

TO BE RACED AS: Twelve races in Breeders Crown No. 20. Separate colt (including geldings) and filly races for 2-year-old and 3-year-old trotters and pacers. Fillies not eligible to the colt races except as provided below. Four separate open races in 2008: Breeders Crown Trot and Breeders Crown Pace (open to 3-year-olds & older, regardless of sex) and Breeders Crown Mare Trot and Breeders Crown Mare Pace (open to fillies & mares, 3-year-olds & older).

TO BE RACED AT: Races to be held at the host track ("Track") or the tracks to which they are awarded by The Hambletonian Society ("Society"). Dates and locations will be published in the U.S.T.A. Stakes Guide in the year of the races. If for any reason it becomes impractical or undesirable in the opinion of the Society to hold any one or more of these races at the track designated, the Society reserves the right to change the date and/or location of either any or all races.

CANCELLATION: The Society further reserves the right to cancel either one or more of the races if for reasons beyond its control it becomes impractical or undesirable in the opinion of the Society to conduct said race or races. If an event is not raced due to circumstances beyond its control, the Society's responsibility and liability will be limited to refunding without interest nomination, sustaining (including future eligibility payments) and starting fees collected toward canceled events that have not been disbursed at the time of cancellation. These monies will be prorated among the owners of the horses eligible as of the time of cancellation.

For purposes of these conditions, stallion nomination fees for Breeders Crown No. 20 will be disbursed in 2003 Breeders Crown races as determined by the Society. In the circumstance of cancellation of any or all Breeders Crown events in 2003, stallion nomination fees shall not be refunded.

Refunds of yearling nominations, supplemental nomination fees, sustaining payments, supplemental declaration fees and starting fees shall be paid to the registered owner(s) of the eligible horses at the time of cancellation. These monies will be prorated among the owners of the horses still eligible as of the time of cancellation.

PURSE: It is estimated that the purses will be no less than \$300,000 with the exception of the Mare Trot and Mare Pace which will be no less than \$250,000. The Society, however, reserves the right to scale back the prescribed minimum estimated purses.

STALLION NOMINATION FEE: Due and payable November 15, 2002, in the amount of the advertised stud fee for the 2003 breeding season (\$500 U.S. funds minimum), provided, however, that for first-year stallions placed in commercial service (which would not include test breedings) after November 15, the nomination fee in the amount of the first season stud fee must be paid within 60 days after the stallion first breeds a mare. In no event will any first-year stallion nomination fee be accepted after October 15, 2003. The Hambletonian Society reserves the right to determine the stallion nomination fee of those stallions whose 2003 service is advertised as private treaty, or if the amount of the fee is not advertised. This payment covers 2003 matings (foals of 2004).

NOMINATION FEE TO BE ELIGIBLE TO RACE AS A 2-YEAR-OLD IN 2006, AND/OR AS A 3-YEAR-OLD IN 2007 (U.S. Funds only):

On Yearlings in 2005

Nominated horses (including those that have otherwise entered by supplemental nomination or supplemental declaration as provided below) must be properly identified to the satisfaction of the Society at the time of nomination, including but not limited to certifying that the nominated horse is registered as a twin or is the only foal of the mare in 2004. The Society will not recognize foals as twins if produced through embryo/ovum transfer. If produced through embryo/ovum transfer, only the donor mare's first born foal in 2004 will be eligible for nomination. The Owner(s) of the nominated horse agree to indemnify and hold the Society and the Track harmless from any and all claims, suits or damages, including attorney's fees, arising out of or related in any way to such certification.

NOMINATION AND ELIGIBILITY TO THE 2-YEAR-OLD AND 3-YEAR-OLD DIVISIONS: For foals of 2004 by nominated stallions, the May 15, 2005 yearling fee and the 2-year-old sustaining payments must be made to be eligible to the 2-year-old races. To be eligible as a 3-year-old, the May 15, 2005 yearling nomination and the March 15, 2006 future eligibility payment and the 3-year-old sustaining payments must be made.

Foals of 2004 by sires named to Breeders Crown No. 20, but not nominated in the May 15, 2005 yearling payment, may be made eligible by a supplemental nomination fee of \$1,000, due on or before February 15, 2006. This supplemental nomination payment is in addition to the normal schedule of sustaining payments for the 2-year-old and 3-year-old races.

Foals of 2004 by sires named to Breeders Crown No. 20, but not nominated in the May 15, 2005 yearling payment or February 15, 2006 2-year-old supplemental nomination above, may be made eligible by a 3-year-old supplemental nomination fee of \$10,000, due on or before February 15, 2007. This supplemental nomination payment is in addition to the normal schedule of sustaining payments for the 3-year-old races.

CONTINUING ELIGIBILITY TO THE OPEN DIVISION IN 2008 AND TO THE OPEN DIVISIONS SUBSEQUENT TO 2008: Foals of 2004, whose sires were nominated to this Breeders Crown No. 20, as well as foals of 2003 and older, whose sires were nominated to the Breeders Crown for their particular foaling crop, will be eligible to the open races in 2008 and to the open races in subsequent years upon payment of the specified payment(s) for the particular year's open events. Eligible pacing mares will have the option of entering either the Breeders Crown Pace, or the Mare Pace to which they have been nominated. Eligible trotting mares will have the option of entering either the Breeders Crown Trot, or the Mare Trot to which they have been nominated.

ELIGIBILITY OF 3-YEAR-OLDS TO THE OPEN DIVISION: 3-year-olds kept eligible by the specified payments in Breeders Crown No. 20 will also be eligible to the open division in 2007. Eligible 3-year-old colts (and geldings) will have the option of entering the Breeders Crown Trot or the Breeders Crown Pace, and the 3-year-old colt race to which they have been nominated. Eligible 3-year-old trotting fillies will have the option of entering the Breeders Crown Trot, or Mare Trot, and the 3-year-old Filly race to which they have been nominated. Eligible 3-year-old pacing fillies will have the option of entering either the Breeders Crown Pace, or Mare Pace, and the 3-year-old Filly race to which they have been nominated. 3-year-olds may start in both the 3-year-old race to which they are eligible and an open event if their connections so desire, upon declaration at the normal time and payment of the required starting fee.

ELIGIBILITY TO THE 2008 OPEN DIVISION FOR FOALS OF 2004 AND OLDER THAT HAVE BEEN SUPPLEMENTED TO THE RACES IN PRIOR YEARS: Horses which were made eligible to the Breeders Crown in previous years by a payment of a supplemental declaration fee, will be eligible to the open races in 2008 under the normal schedule of payments beginning on February 15, 2008 as described above and the normal starting fee as provided below.

DECLARATION TO START AND STARTING FEE: The declaration to start shall be due at the Track where the race is being held by the prescribed time and date scheduled by the Society. ORC Rules 11.02.01 and 11.02.02 require that a horse to have a clean charted line in a purse, qualifying or schooling race, not more than 45 clear days before the closing of declarations and its individual time in any one of its last three charted lines, not more than 45 clear days before the closing of declarations, meets the published standards for age and gait for the track size where it raced or qualified after the judges have given the appropriate allowances for track conditions, or is on the judges list or is otherwise ineligible to race. The requirement that such a performance line be charted may be waived by the ORC for horses coming from outside North America. Elimination heats, if necessary, may be held on the same program as the final heat, or in the previous ten days as determined by the Society.

The starting fee shall be due at the time of declaration and payable not later than one hour prior to the post time of the race or the first elimination heat, as the case may be. The starting fee will not be refunded once the horse is declared to start unless the horse dies between the time of declaration to start and the start of the race or elimination heat in which the horse was to compete.

SPECIAL ELIGIBILITY FOR FOREIGN WINNERS: An invitation to compete in the 2008 Breeders Crown Trot will be extended to the winner of the following international events in 2008: the *Prix d'Amérique* (France), the *Gran Premio Lotteria Nazionale di Agnano* (Italy), and the *Solvalla Elitloppet* (Sweden) and both 2007 and 2008 Inter-dominion Trotting Finals (Australia & New Zealand). Likewise, an invitation to compete in the 2008 Breeders Crown Pace will be extended to the winners of both the Inter-dominion Pacing Final in 2007 and 2008 (Australia & New Zealand). Each of these winners will be eligible to start in these Breeders Crown 2008 open events, subject to the payment of a starting fee plus an additional amount equal to the sustaining fees of US\$3,000 (US\$2,000 for mares) and must be entered at the time designated by the Society. An invited foreign winner that has been kept eligible as of March 15, having made the required sustaining payments, must pay only the amount of the starting fee. The starting fee for the Open Trot shall be US\$12,000; the starting fee for the Open Pace shall be US\$10,000.

In the event that a single trotter wins more than one of the designated European races, or two or more of the invited winners of these European races do not accept the invitation to compete in the 2008 Breeders Crown Trot, the Society, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to invite up to two other trotters from outside North America. This horse or these horses will be eligible to start in the Breeders Crown Trot, subject to the payment of the starting fee plus an additional amount equal to the above sustaining fees and must be entered at the time designated by the Society.

If an elimination or eliminations are required, the invited horses, properly declared, automatically advance to the Final and do not start in the eliminations. If one or more of the foreign invitees automatically advance to the final, the North American-based horse with the highest seasonal money earnings in 2008, as determined below, will likewise automatically advance to the final.

SUPPLEMENTAL DECLARATION FEE (Due & Payable at the Time of Declaration, U.S. Funds only):

There is no supplemental declaration allowed for the 2-year-old races in 2006.

SUPPLEMENTAL ENTRIES FOR THE THREE-YEAR-OLD AND OPEN DIVISION: Otherwise ineligible 3-year-old and older horses to the Breeders Crown No. 20 may be made eligible to the 3-year-old races in 2008 and/or the open races in 2008 with a declaration to start accompanied by payment of a supplemental declaration fee no later than the prescribed time and date scheduled by the Society. The declaration is due at the Track where the race is being held. For 3-year-old races the supplemental declaration fee (U.S. funds only) shall be equal to \$55,000, plus the amount of the normal starting fee. The supplementary payment for the Open Trot will be equal to \$63,000 plus \$12,000, the amount of the normal starting fee. The supplementary payment for the Mare Trot will be equal to \$26,250 plus \$5,000, the amount of the normal starting fee. For the Open Pace, the supplemental declaration fee (U.S. funds only) shall be equal to \$52,500 plus \$10,000, the amount of the normal starting fee. For the Mare Pace, the supplemental declaration fee (U.S. funds only) will be equal to \$31,500, plus \$6,000 the amount of the normal starting fee. At least fifty percent (50%) of all supplemental declarations shall be added to the amount of purse of the specific race.

For horses for which the supplemental declaration fee is paid, no other fee of any kind is required. The supplemental declaration fee is non-refundable once the horse is declared to start unless the horse dies between the time of declaration to start and the start of the race or the elimination heat in which the horse was to compete, as the case may be. All supplemental declaration fees shall be made payable to the Hambletonian Society.

NOTICE: U.S.T.A. Rule 11, Section 3 provides: "Failure to make any payment required by the conditions constitutes an automatic withdrawal from the event." The Hambletonian Society will construe payment of nominating and sustaining fees to require that cash or check duly honored upon presentation be received at the time specified in U.S.T.A. Rule 12, Section 4.

BREEDERS CROWN NO. 20 STALLION FUND DISTRIBUTION: Breeders Crown No. 20 stallion nomination fees will be allocated as determined by the Society among the 2003 Breeders Crown races. If the Tracks add any money to the 2003 Breeders Crown purses, the Hambletonian Society reserves the right to deduct an equal amount from the Breeders Crown No. 20 stallion nomination fees, for administrative, promotional and television production expenses.

Additionally the Hambletonian Society reserves the right to deduct up to 10 percent (%) of the Breeders Crown No. 20 stallion nomination fees to fund promotional expenses.

Except as provided herein, under no circumstances will stallion nomination fees be refunded.

PAYMENT DISTRIBUTION: All final heats in the Breeders Crown No. 20 will be raced for an estimated amount that is no less than the sum total of the sustaining payments plus the amount of the starting fees less the purses of the elimination heats if necessary.

Purses for Breeders Crown No. 20 for foals of 2004 to race as 2-year-olds in 2006 will consist of the 2006 sustaining payments and all of the starting fees that will be credited to the specific races. The Society may add purse monies, if necessary, from stallion nomination and other nomination fees received for Breeders Crown in 2006 and in prior years to fund purses as determined by the Society.

Purses for Breeders Crown No. 20 to race as 3-year-olds in 2007 will consist of the 2007 sustaining payments, starting fees and supplemental declaration fees that will be credited to the specific races. The Society may add purse monies, if necessary, from stallion nomination and other nomination fees received for Breeders Crown in 2007 and in prior years to fund purses as determined by the Society.

Purses for Breeders Crown No. 20 to race as 4-year-olds (and for other eligible horses) in 2008 will consist of sustaining payments, starting fees and at least 50% of the supplemental declaration fees that will be credited to the specific races. The Society may add purse monies, if necessary, from stallion nomination and other nomination fees received for Breeders Crown in 2008 and in prior years to fund purses as determined by the Society.

IMAGE WAIVER: As a condition of participation in the Breeders Crown No. 20, the Owner(s) of the nominated horse(s) hereby grants to the Society, its representatives, successors, and assigns the absolute right to copyright and publish, use or reuse still and motion photographic images of its horses, drivers, trainers, employees, officers and agents, in whole or in part, in composite or in distorted character, with or without use of names, in color or otherwise, for the purpose of promotion, advertising, trade or other lawful purpose in any and all media. Owner(s) waives any right to inspect and/or approve the finished product or the copy that may be used in connection therewith or the use to which it might be applied. Owner(s) further agrees to inform his drivers, trainers, employees, officers and agents of the authority granted to the Society herein, to hold Society harmless from any and all liability and damages, and to indemnify the Society from same should any such owner(s), driver(s), trainer(s), employee(s), officer(s) and agent(s) challenge Society's rights as set forth above.

TESTING WAIVER AND CONSENT: As a further condition of participation in the Breeders Crown ("Race"), which is a private event owned by the Hambletonian Society ("Society"), the Owner ("Owner", which includes all beneficial owners at the time) of the nominated horse ("Horse") which has been declared (*i.e.* entered) to start in the Race hereby grant to the Society, its representatives, employees and agents, including a licensed veterinarian designated by the Society, and assigns the absolute right and authority to:

- 1.) Conduct one or more physical examinations of the Horse at any time prior to the Race, regardless of where it is stabled;
- 2.) Draw blood and other specimens one or more times from the Horse for immediate testing;
- 3.) Freeze or otherwise preserve split-samples of the specimens for future testing and send such samples to a laboratory designated by the Society and;
- 4.) Require, at the sole discretion of the Society, the Horse to stable on the grounds of the racetrack ("Track") where the Race is being contested or other designated premises for a reasonable period of time prior to the Race which will be specified by the Society.

After declaration and until the day of the Race, the detection in the Horse of evidence of blood doping agents including, but not limited to, the following: human recombinant erythropoietin, darbepoetin, Aransep®, Oxyglobin®, or Hemopure®, shall be considered a violation of these conditions and will result in scratching or disqualification of the Horse from the Race and forfeiture by the Owner of the Starting Fee, whether or not actually paid but which is due at the time of declaration:

Note: The Hambletonian Society may interpret "evidence of blood doping agents" to include elevated titers of anti-recombinant antibodies of these agents.

If such evidence is detected after the Eliminations and before the Final of the Race, this shall result in the disqualification of the Horse in the official result of the Elimination, the loss of the purse, if any, and the immediate return of any forfeited purse funds to the Society for redistribution and the Horse will not be allowed to start in the Final. If the evidence is detected after the Final of the Race but prior the distribution of the purse of the Final, this shall be considered a violation of these conditions and will result in the disqualification of the Horse in the official results of the Elimination and the Final, the loss of the purse, if any, and the immediate return of any forfeited purse funds earned in the Elimination to the Society for redistribution.

If any such evidence is detected in future testing of the split-sample taken from the Horse, it shall be considered a violation of these conditions and will result in the disqualification of the Horse, the loss of the purse, if any, and shall require immediate return of any forfeited purse funds to the Society for redistribution.

Should the Society determine that, as a result of any of the above procedures or otherwise, a possible violation of New Jersey Racing Commission ("NJRC") Rules, including but not limited to rules concerning prohibited substances and/or procedures has occurred, the matter will be referred to the NJRC for possible additional action.

The Owner agrees to fully co-operate with the Society to require that his trainer, employees or agents to identify and make the Horse available to have blood drawn or procure other specimens on demand and/or be examined as described above without prior notice. The Owner understands and agrees that failure to provide access to the Horse or otherwise not co-operating with the Society, its representatives, employees and agents, including a licensed veterinarian designated by the Society, in the exercise of the rights granted herein, may result in scratching the Horse from the Race and forfeiture of the Starting Fee. The Owner further agrees to notify his drivers, trainers, veterinarians, employees, officers and agents of the authority granted to the Society herein, to hold the Society and the Track harmless and indemnify the Society, the NJSEA and the Track, its representatives, agents, officers, directors and employees from any and all claims, liability, damages and attorneys fees which may result from any challenge by any such Owner, drivers, trainers, veterinarians, employees, officers and agents or other third parties to the Society's rights as set forth above.

In the event of a post-Race disqualification and redistribution of purse funds paid out, the Owner also agrees to indemnify the Society, the NJSEA and the Track, their representatives, officers, directors, employees, and agents from any and all claims, liability, damages, expenses and attorneys fees which any of them may incur in attempting to recover the funds from the Owner, trainer and driver and to redistribute said funds. The owners, trainers and drivers of these horses which are due these funds under the disqualification also agree that the Society, the NJSEA and the Track have no liability for any delay in the recovery or transmission of the funds.

RACING CONDITIONS: All heats to be raced one dash at one mile. None of these events shall be held in divisions.

If the number of horses declared into any race is large enough to require more than one (1) trailing horse in the second tier, an elimination, or eliminations, will be held for that race to "qualify" only enough horses that can be accommodated by the number of positions in the front tier of the starting gate and there will be no second tier in the final heat. If the number entered is less, there will be no eliminations necessary. Eliminations, if necessary, will race for a minimum purse of \$25,000 each. Such elimination races will be held in accordance with U.S.T.A. Rule 13, except as provided below.

One Elimination: If an elimination is required because more than eleven (11), but less than fourteen (14) are entered, there will be a single elimination to "qualify" only enough horses that can be accommodated by the number of positions in the front tier of the starting gate as follows:

a.) In the Open Trot and Open Pace, the invited winners of the designated foreign "classic" races, and/or other horses from outside North America invited by the Society as permitted herein, that are declared, shall automatically advance to the Final regardless of earnings. If eliminations are required and one or more of the foreign invitees automatically advance to the final, the North American-based horse with the highest seasonal money earnings in that year, as determined below, may likewise automatically advance to the final.

b.) the other declared horses, those with the least total earnings in the period from January 1 of that year up to time of declaration, will be selected to race in a single elimination field with no more starters than can score in a single tier with no trailers. Money earnings for races outside the U.S. will be calculated at the exchange rate for U.S. dollars as determined by the U.S.T.A..

c.) The remaining declared horses, if any (i.e. those with the higher money earnings that cannot be accommodated in the front tier of the elimination field), may elect to automatically advance to the Final ("receive a bye"). If any of the higher money earners, as determined above, elect instead to race in the elimination, other declared horses, in preference of the greatest earnings, may be selected to automatically advance to the Final. If no horses elect to advance to the final, that elimination will be conducted with trailers.

d.) The best finishers in the single elimination plus those that have automatically been advanced to the Final will make up the field for the Final with no trailing horses in the second tier.

Two or More Eliminations: If the number of horses declared into any race is such that, if divided at the time of the draw the fields would provide at least seven (7) horses in each of the eliminations, then that race will be split into two or more eliminations with no trailers.

Elimination Winners Selects Posts: If the eliminations are contested in the week prior to the Final, post positions in the Final will be determined by an open draw with the exception that the elimination winners, in an order determined by lot, may choose their post position for the Final. The trainer of each winner must select the post position by a time specified by the Society, or that elimination winner will placed in the open draw with the rest of the Final field. If eliminations are contested on the same day as the Final, all post positions for the Final will be earned as specified in U.S.T.A. Rule 13, section 3, subsection 1.

Also Eligibles: In addition, two horses will be selected from those in the eliminations that do not qualify for the Final to be designated "Also Eligible" ("AE") for each Final. The preference to determine which is the first "Also Eligible" ("AE1") shall be determined by taking the horse that placed highest in the official order of finish of all elimination divisions, but did not qualify for the Final; in the event horses are equal in the finish position, final preference will be determined by the highest money earnings in that year. The other horse will be the second "Also Eligible" ("AE2").

Replacing Scratched Horses: Scratched horses in the Final will be replaced in the following manner: a.) If post positions have not been drawn the AE horse will take its place in the normal draw; b.) If post positions have already been drawn, the AE horse will assume the position on the outside of the remaining starters in the front tier of the starting gate, in the order determined in the above paragraph. The AE2 horse, if drawn in by a second scratched horse, will start outside the AE1 horse. No horse will be moved into the Final as a replacement after the official "scratch time" deadline for publication of the official program, unless the "also eligible" horse(s) have been published in the official program in accordance with racing commission rules.

Breaking Ties or Deadbeats in the Eliminations: Should two or more horses tie for the final position(s) by virtue of their finish in the elimination(s) above, such tied horses shall be eliminated from the Final by giving preference to the horse(s) with the highest earnings in that year, as compiled by the U.S.T.A. and including the elimination earnings. In the event of a dead heat for the last position(s) in one or more of the eliminations to qualify or advance to the Final, a horse in another elimination finishing in the same position and not in a dead heat, regardless of earnings, would have preference over a horse finishing in a dead heat. (i.e. With two eliminations, a horse finishing fifth has preference over the two horses that were dead heated for fifth.) Finally, if tied horses have equal seasonal earnings, then the finalist(s) will be drawn by lot with each of the horses having trainer or representative present at that draw.

Accidents in the Eliminations: If, because of an accident in an elimination, an insufficient number of horses finish the heat and qualify for the Final, the remaining finalist(s) and "also eligible(s)" will be selected (in the preference of the highest earnings in that year as determined above) from the remaining non-offending horses in that elimination where the accident occurred.

Retention, Detention and Testing: All starters in the eliminations and the Final are subject to the policy of the Track as well as the Testing Procedure specified in these Conditions.

MONEY DIVISION: Purses for all races will be divided 50-25-12-8-5%.

DRIVERS AND TRAINERS FEES: The drivers and trainers fees may be disbursed in accordance with the policy of the Track at the time of the race.

TRANSFER: Any eligible horse that changes gait may be transferred at any time. Sustaining payments already made remain with the originally nominated race.

PROTESTS, INVESTIGATIONS AND/OR DISPUTES In the event of any protest, investigation or dispute with respect to the results of the Breeders Crown or any races related thereto, the Society may, if it is in possession of the purse, at its option deliver the purse, or the disputed portion thereof, to the Track which shall hold such purse in a segregated interest-bearing bank account, to be disbursed by the Track following the final binding and non-appealable determination of any such protest, investigation or dispute. Further, the Owner shall hold the Society and the Track, their officers, directors, members, employees and agents harmless from, against and in respect of any and all claims, actions, losses, damages, liabilities, judgment, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees and disbursements) resulting from any such protest, investigation or dispute.

DISPUTES: In the case of any dispute as to the interpretation of these conditions, the decision of the Executive Committee of The Hambletonian Society, Inc. shall be final. All fees and payments in any race are accepted on the condition that all claims, objections and appeals arising out of the Breeders Crown races or with respect to any interpretation of any rules or conditions of the Breeders Crown races, or otherwise shall be decided by Executive Committee of the Hambletonian Society, Inc., which decision shall be final and not subject to appeal. Any appeal rights which the owner shall otherwise have are waived.

RULES: The Hambletonian Society reserves the right to add to, amend or delete the conditions of all or any part of the Breeders Crown program, without liability including but not limited to:

a.) classes and divisions of races, eligibility of horses, fees and payments, and the amount of purses to be awarded to each race, elimination and final heat;

b.) time and/or date of declarations and the time and/or date of the supplemental declarations;
c.) dates and/or the location of any or all of the races including the date of the elimination heats;
d.) other matters that the Society determines to be necessary and appropriate for the proper administration, promotion and implementation of the Breeders Crown program.

Unless otherwise specified and except as may be affected by a state or provincial racing Commission or Board, U.S.T.A. rules not in conflict with these conditions of Breeders Crown No. 20 to govern, as well as the Track rules & regulations. The conditions, rules & regulations, shall be those in effect at the time of the race.
